PRIZES & TROPHIES

A CHAMPION PRIZE OF £5.00 AND A ROSETTE will be awarded for the best exhibit in the fodder & grain section.

A PERPETUAL SILVER CHALLENGE CUP, kindly donated by the late Mr R R Jones, will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in these classes.

AN ENGRAVED WHISKY GLASS will be awarded to the Best Grain Exhibit, Best Fodder Exhibit and the Most Interesting Exhibit. Once an exhibitor has won four glasses, the Society will present a jug and tray to accompany the set.

A PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP, kindly given by Peter White, will be awarded for the Best Exhibit in classes 334 and 335.

WHEAT GUIDE 2020

Group 1

Varieties that produce consistent milling and baking performance. Group 1 varieties are not interchangeable; some are better suited to specific uses than others. It is therefore important to understand end-use requirements.

CRUSOE, GALLANT, RGT ILLUSTRIOUS, SKYFALL, SOLSTICE, KWS TRINITY
Spring wheat: MULIKA

Group 2

This group comprises varieties that exhibit bread-making potential but are not suited to all grists. Some are consistent, but not as good as those in Group 1; some perform inconsistently while others are suited to specialist flours.

CORDIALE, KWS-LILI, KWS SISKIN, PANORAMA.
Spring wheats: GRANARY KWS-WILLOW, TYBALT

Group 3

Soft varieties for biscuit, cake and other flours.

KWS BARREL, KWS BASSET, BRITANNIA, CLAIRE, RGT-CONVERSION, SCOUT, SPYDER, ZULU

Group 4

These varieties are grown mainly as feed wheats. However, some (such as the examples listed below) may be used by millers in certain 'general purpose' grists if they achieve the contractual standards, but are unlikely to attract a premium.

FODDER & GRAIN SECTION RULES & CONDITIONS

No Exhibitor will be awarded more than two prizes in any one Class.

All exhibits must be staged by 12 noon on Friday 11th September. Judging will commence promptly at 2pm on Friday 11th September.

In classes with only one entry, the committee reserves the right to award second prize money only, if in the opinion of the judge, the entry is of insufficient merit to justify a first prize. No second prize will be awarded in any class in which there are not at least three entries or third unless there are at least four entries.

All grain must have been grown, by the exhibitor, on his/her own farm, during 2020.

Exhibits should be removed between 5pm and 5.30pm on Sat 12 Sep. Any roots or grain exhibits left on the showfield after this time shall become the property of the Society. The Society will not be liable for any loss or damage to any exhibit.

Class 360	SIX STEMS OF MAIZE, to be drawn from not less than half an acre
Class 361	½ CWT OF POTATOES (unwashed). To be drawn from not less than half an acre. Boxes will be provided
Class 362	SAMPLE OF SILAGE, not less than 14 lbs, (with or without additives)
Class 363	SAMPLE OF SILAGE, not less than 14 lbs, (to be taken from a large bale)
Class 364	ORGANIC FODDER, Silage or Hay

COLLECTION OF FEED STUFFS CLASS

Class 365 COLLECTION OF FEEDING STUFFS

As grown by exhibitor, excluding Cubes Meals, suitable for maintenance and winter milk production, to be displayed in a space not exceeding 8ft x 3ft.

Class 366 ALTERNATIVE CROP

Any crop not otherwise specified, including organically grown and organic hay Open to grower or seed merchant. If not harvested, a sample of growing crop should be provided e.g. a sheaf. Entries for this class should include details of what crop is used for, together with a photograph, to enable the committee to put up a display board for public interest. (Space allowed 3ft width.)

GRAIN CLASSES

Entry Fee: £4.00 **Prize Money (Points):** 1st £8 (4pts), 2nd £6 (3pts), 3rd £4 (2pts)
A display sample sack for corn will be provided for exhibitors, approximately 10 lbs. (Exhibition sacks not to be removed). All varieties of corn are to be named. Exhibitors may display the name of seed supplier if they so wish.
The exhibitor is responsible for the allocation of grain to the correct class no.
